

## Chronic Obstructive Disease Medications

Control Medications: these medicines are not used to treat flare-ups.

### Corticosteroids:

Beclomethasone (Qvar)  
Fluticasone (Flovent)  
Ciclesonide (Alvesco)  
Mometasone (Asmanex)  
Budesonide (Pulmincort)

### Long Acting Beta-Agonists (LABAs):

Arformoterol (Brovana)  
Formoterol (Foradil)  
Salmeterol (Serevent)  
Indacaterol (Arcapta)

### Corticosteroids + Long Acting Beta-Agonists:

Budesonide + Formoterol (Symbicort)  
Fluticasone + Salmeterol (Advair)  
Fluticasone + Vilanterol (Breo Ellipta)

### Long Acting Anticholinergics:

Aclidinium (Tudorza Pressair)  
Tiotropium (Spiriva)

### Anticholinergic + Long Acting Beta-Agonist:

Umeclidinium + Vilanterol (Anoro Ellipta)

### Anticholinergic + Beta-Agonist:

Ipratropium + Albuterol (Combivent Respimat)

### Phosphodiesterase Inhibitor:

Roflumilast (Daliresp)

Quick relief Medications: these medicines are called rescue medications.

### Short Acting Beta-Agonists (SABAs):

Albuterol (ProAir HFA, Proventil HFA, Ventolin HFA)  
Levalbuterol (Xopenex HFA)  
Metaproterenol  
Terbutaline

### Oral Steroids:

Methylprednisolone  
Prednisone
